CSU LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Colorado State University acknowledges, with respect, that the land we are on today is the traditional and ancestral homelands of the Arapaho, Cheyenne, and Ute Nations and peoples. This was also a site of trade, gathering, and healing for numerous other Native tribes. We recognize the Indigenous peoples of this land and all the relatives within it. As these words of acknowledgment are spoken and heard, the ties Nations have to their traditional homelands are renewed and reaffirmed.

CSU is founded as a land-grant institution, and we accept that our mission must encompass access to education and inclusion. And, significantly, that our founding came at a dire cost to Native Nations and peoples whose land this University was built upon. This acknowledgment is the education and inclusion we must practice in recognizing our institutional history, responsibility, and commitment.






GRADUATE ASSISTANT FOR CURC

- 2. Brief resume or CV;
- 3. A list of regularly scheduled time commitments that cannot be rescheduled to accommodate the duties of this position, e.g., teaching assistant duties, classes, group meeting, etc.;
- 4. Name and contact information of a person who can support the application. For graduate student applicants, this should be the graduate advisor.
