CSU LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Colorado State University acknowledges, with respect, that the land we are on today is the traditional and ancestral homelands of the Arapaho, Cheyenne, and Ute Nations and peoples. This was also a site of trade, gathering, and healing for numerous other Native tribes. We recognize the Indigenous peoples of this land and all the relatives within it. As these words of acknowledgment are spoken and heard, the ties Nations have to their traditional homelands are renewed and reaffirmed.

And, significantly, that our founding came at a dire cost to Native Nations and peoples whose land this University was built upon. ADVOCACY UPDATES



- Campus Safety
 - RamRide is running Lyft codes (worth \$13) Thursday-Saturday nights. Those codes are available on the RamRide app and on RamRide's Instagram account. The codes are active 10pm-3am.
 - Expect to bring RamRide's back online in the spring (Friday and Saturday night) and continue to run Lyft codes on Thursday nights.
 - There is also <u>RamRide Secure</u>, a program for students who are experiencing a temporary or infrequent transportation insecurity. A student who usually rides the bus to and from campus but needs occasional rides home because they stay on campus late after the buses have stopped running, would be a good candidate for RamRide Secure. Students apply and once approved (almost all are approved), they are given up to 10 Lyft codes (worth \$13) that they can use at their discretion (anytime, any day).




